## Water-Friendly Home Improvements

With many of use spending more time at home, it may be an excellent opportunity to make some improvements to your property which can also benefit our local streams and improve the environment.

#### SOME TIPS FOR HOME IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS:

- Before beginning an outdoor project, locate the nearest storm drains and protect them from debris and other materials.
- Sweep up and properly dispose of construction debris such as concrete and mortar.
- Use hazardous substances like paints, solvents, and cleaners in the smallest amounts possible, and follow the directions on the label. Clean up spills immediately and dispose of the waste safely. Store substances properly to avoid leaks and spills.
- Purchase and use nontoxic, biodegradable, recycled, and recyclable products whenever possible.
- Consider directing downspouts away from paved surfaces onto lawns and other measures to increase infiltration and reduce polluted runoff.

#### SPRING CLEANUP


